- few vähe (loendatavate sõnadega) = hardly any.
- Few friends visited me. = Not many friends visited me.

A lot of - much - many :

■ A lot of :

■ A lot of can be used in all sentences: affirmative, negative and interrogative.

Much - many :


Much and many are used in <u>negative</u> and <u>interrogative</u> sentences.

They are rarely used in affirmative sentences, except if they begin the sentence . (see below)

■ Much is used with <u>uncountable nouns</u> (for example: 'much English')

■ Many is used with <u>countable nouns</u> (for example : 'many words').

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative
We learn a lot of English.	I don't know a lot of English.	Do you learn a lot of English?
I make a lot of mistakes.	I don't know much English.	Do you know much English?
BUT:		
Much of our food is exported.	I don't know a lot of words.	Do you make a lot of mistakes?
Many people drive too fast.	I don't know many words.	Do you make many mistakes?

Use with plural nouns

How many animals are there? How many balls can you carry? How many blades of grass are there? How many cars can you see? How many children are playing? How many colours of the rainbow? How many eggs for breakfast? How many fish can you see swimming? How many games shall we play? How many grains of sand in your hand? How many pieces of cake did you eat? How many planks of wood are there? How many toys do you have?

Use with singular nouns

How much cheese is left?
How much effort does it take?
How much farther to walk?
How much homework must I do?
How much milk is in the bottle?
How much noise can you hear?
How much rope do I need?
How much sand is on the beach?
How much soup is in the bowl?
How much stuff is in my room?
How much time do we have left?
How much traffic is there?
How much water should I drink?
